The organization empowers women to continue to grow and achieve success in the community with a "By Women, for Women" motto. Annual activities include a leadership and networking conference in Washington, D.C., periodic round-table discussions and fundraising on behalf of other mission-aligned organizations.

Representing every discipline, the attendees include general contractors, subcontractors, developers, architects, engineers, representatives from trade associations, nonprofits, construction consulting companies and law firms from across the U.S. and Canada.
